1. Urgent action: Protecting Nigeria's children

LAGOS, Nigeria — The Nigerian chapter of the Pan-African Catholic Theology and Pastoral Network (PACTPAN) has issued a clarion call for coordinated action to address the growing crisis of child abductions. Described as a threat to national security, education, and sustainable development, the issue was the focus of the recent webinar, "Child Kidnapping in Nigeria: Implications for Education, Security and Sustainable Development."

Moderated by Vivian Emesowum, the webinar brought together faith leaders, educators, and policy advocates to examine the root causes of the crisis, including systemic corruption and the erosion of moral values. Participants agreed that protecting children requires a coordinated response involving families, schools, government institutions, and faith communities.
